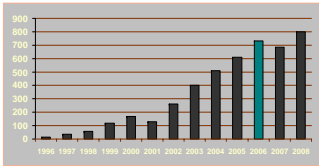
HISTORY

- > Founded 1992 by Dr. Evaleen Jones
- > Annual budget of \$4.1 million
- > 4,500+ students have completed programs
- > Supports & works with 300+ medical professionals around the world
- > Donated \$8 million in medical supplies and equipment since 1995
- > Overhead: 4.8% ('07 audit)

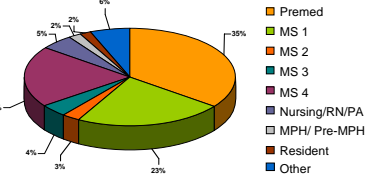


Growth in CFHI's Student Numbers

Participants represent the following countries: USA, Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Europe, Asia, Central and South America as well as Africa.

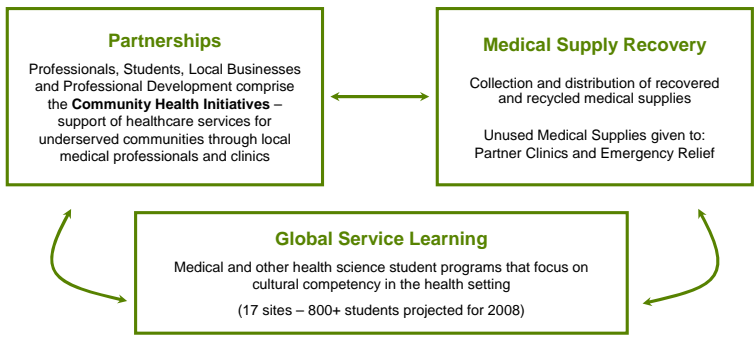

CFHI has built partnerships with various U.S. universities, including: **Stanford Medical School**, **Oregon University System** (IE3 Global Internship Program); **Harvard University** (College Corps) and **Princeton University** (Health Professions Advising Office and the Pace Center for Service-Learning). Most recently, CFHI has partnered with **UC Davis** to offer a Quarter-Long study abroad program in Oaxaca, Mexico that highlights Latino/Latina health issues. One of the main aims of the program is to encourage health science students to develop multicultural competence with monolingual immigrant communities in the U.S. by serving as **global health ambassadors**. This program is targeted at "minority" students with a strong commitment to volunteering with underserved populations in California.

COMMUNITY HEALTH INITIATIVES



In 2004, CFHI launched our first round of Community Health Initiatives to support grassroots projects devised by the doctors and other community leaders who host and teach our students. Below are brief descriptions of some initiatives we are supporting in 2007-08:



> **Bolivia: Children Living in Jails** — Integrates 3 complementary phases: medical aid, psychological and social support for children who must accompany their parents to prison.



> **India: Health Promoters** — In 2004 CFHI began training 9 local women, elected by their villages as Community Health Promoters. Since '04 these women have undergone trainings on topics and skills such as: health behavior, health education, assessment of basic need of the community, neonatal care, child illness, family planning and routine immunization.



> **Ecuador: Stemming the Rise of Type 2 Diabetes** — Designs a tracking system for 130 patients with Type 2 Diabetes in the rural and remote areas of the Ecuadorian Amazon.

> **Mexico: "Youth United" for HIV/AIDS Awareness** — Founded as an HIV/AIDS awareness outreach and education program for local High School students, by 3 CFHI students while participating in CFHI's Tropical Medicine & Rural Health program.

> **Ecuador: Healthcare for Remote Jungle Communities** — Supports the sixth year of trainings for 47 Community Health Promoters in the Ecuadorian Amazon to serve indigenous communities.

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
