

CFHI Community Health Projects

At the heart of CFHI's work are CFHI Global Health Education Programs.

Offering 25 programs in 5 countries, CFHI is setting the standard for community-based global health education. In 2010 CFHI sent 645 students to our programs in communities around the globe.

Maternal and Infant Mortality in Southern Mexico

CFHI collaborated on training of lay midwives (known locally as parteras) in how to recognize impending complications of birth, prevent infection through sterile birth technique, and evaluate newborn babies for distress. To improve the recognition of fetal distress in community-based clinics, CFHI provided and rolled out Doppler technology to detect fetal heart sounds sooner and more accurately. Evaluation of this project demonstrated a statistically significant improvement in the knowledge and competency of parteras.


CFHI offers sex education and substance abuse trainings and workshops to about 2,000 adolescents, aged between 12 and 20. Funding will go to employ a local community health worker, and a local project coordinator, in addition to providing vital logistical support and outreach tools with which to attract local speakers.

Than Gaon Clinic in Than Gaon, India

CFHI maintains the operation of a small clinic that treats the primary healthcare needs of 28 Himalayan villages. Since 1998, this project has served over 50,000 people.

Health Promoter Trainings in Patti, India

CFHI trains nine women elected by their peers from neighboring villages to deal with a variety of healthcare issues, especially in the area of mother and child. The project is now in its tenth year and uses the "train-the-trainer" to provide sustainable grassroots solutions.



In September 2010, in conjunction with the opening of the 65th Session of the General Assembly, CFHI convened a Forum on the Empowerment of Women. The event was an astounding success. Under the skilled moderation of Ambassador from Bangladesh Anwarul Chowdhury, CFHI India Coordinator Hema Pandey and Medical Director Jessica Evert joined other esteemed panelists to discuss the challenges and opportunities facing women on a global stage. This event highlights the important influence CFHI has as an NGO in Special Consultative Status with the ECOSOC of the UN.
