

# **CFHI Community Health Projects**

#### "Children Living in Jails" in La Paz, Bolivia

CFHI established a program that provides basic needs, healthcare and early childhood education, for children living with their incarcerated mothers. Between 200-400 children were served in the main women's incarceration center. The children not only had access to medical attention but also had access to mental health services from a psychologist and social worker. This program has also helped to advance the acceptance of adolescents as a population in need of treatment and care distinct from younger children and distinct from adult healthcare.

#### Than Gaon Clinic in Than Gaon, India

CFHI started and supports the operation of a rural community clinic in the foothills of the Himalayas. CFHI provided an on site doctor, a clinical assistant, medications for the clinic, as well as a local health promoter. They also held weekly health camps in nearby villages throughout the year serving 1,200 patients. Community Garden & Feeding Program for HIV Affected Families in Durban, South Africa

CFHI also helped create a community garden to sustainably plant food for over 150 people per week. Vegetables from the garden are then donated to the needy. They also encourage and support local families who start their own gardens, feeding more members of the community.

#### Health Awareness Days in Durban, South Africa

CFHI sponsored a series of events focused on leading healthy lifestyles. These "Own Your Health" workshops included the importance of good nutrition, exercising, and coping with stress as well as the way to prevent many lifestyle diseases. There was also on site blood pressure screenings, HIV counseling and testing, and PAP smears.
